

LIVING WITH NEUTROPENIA OR PRIMARY IMMUNODEFICIENCY? NO-COST GENETIC TESTING AVAILABLE*



PATH4WARD GENETIC TESTING

There are many genes that may be associated with primary immunodeficiencies (PIs) including WHIM syndrome. WHIM syndrome is a rare PI in which the body's immune system does not function properly and has trouble fighting infections. Some PIs, including WHIM syndrome, may cause neutropenia. Neutropenia is a rare blood condition that causes reduced or complete lack of neutrophils, a type of white blood cell.

No-cost genetic testing is available for eligible people living with chronic neutropenia to help them learn more about their condition.

This genetic test focuses on genes that may be associated with PIs and inherited, also called congenital, neutropenia. There may be other genes associated with PIs and/or neutropenia that are not included in this test.

WHO CAN GET TESTED?

*You may be eligible for genetic testing if 1, 2 and 3 **ALL** apply to you:

- 1. You suspect you have congenital neutropenia OR a primary immunodeficiency
- 2. You have any prior history or a current absolute neutrophil count (ANC) of less than or equal to 1,000 on multiple occasions (not related to drugs, chemotherapy or a viral infection)
- 3. You have one or more of the following:
 - ☐ Repeat and/or severe infections for you or a family member
 - ☐ Lymphopenia, or not having enough white blood cells or lymphocytes to help fight infection
 - ☐ Hypogammaglobulinemia, or low antibody levels that make it hard to fight infections
 - ☐ Warts that are hard to treat or won't go away
 - ☐ A family history of neutropenia

WHY GENETIC TESTING?

Genetic testing can help you learn more about your disease, possible treatment options, and more.

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HOW DOES IT WORK?

You can order the test through a genetic counselor or through your doctor. The PATH4WARD program is administered by Invitae.

ORDER THROUGH A GENETIC COUNSELOR



1. Visit https://www.GenomeMedical.com/Programs/ path4ward to schedule time to speak with a genetic counselor to see if you are eligible for the no-cost genetic test



2. Once you receive the sample collection kit, **complete the kit instructions** and provide a sample



3. Mail the sample collection kit back



Your genetic counselor will share results with you in about 20 days

ORDER THROUGH YOUR DOCTOR



1. Ask your doctor to request a sample collection kit from www.invitae.com/path4ward



2. Provide a sample at your doctor's office or at home



3. Your doctor will mail the sample collection kit back if you're provided a sample at the office. If you collect the sample at home, mail the sample collection kit back with the completed requisition form from your doctor.



4. Results are emailed to your doctor. Check with your doctor in about 20 days for results.

GENETIC COUNSELING

Genetic counselors can help you learn more about genetic testing and if it is right for you. Genome Medical partners with Invitae to provide genetic counselors to help you understand your PATH4WARD test results. This service is provided at no charge.

FAMILY TESTING

If a test result shows a genetic mutation or variant that might may be associated with inherited neutropenia, blood relatives may also be eligible for testing at no cost, within a certain timeframe. Ask your genetic counselor for details.

NO-COST TESTING

There is no cost for this testing.
